Corsair Toiletries Limited recognise, and make use of, the following product/packaging symbols:



The Triman symbol, informs consumers in France, that the product or packaging should not be thrown away with household waste, but can be sorted or taken to a collection point to be recycled.



'Common' recycling symbol, informs consumers that the product or packaging can be recycled (where appropriate facilities exist)

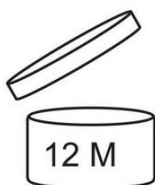
Local authorities publish details of recycling facilities and the types of materials which can be recycled.



The Green Dot. Informs consumers that the manufacturer of the product contributes to the cost of UK recycling. This can be with household waste collected by the authorities, or in containers in public places such as car parks and outside supermarkets.

The Green Dot also informs customers - in other European countries - that the packaging should be disposed of according to their national regulations and waste treatment legislation.
