
The Triman symbol, (combined with other recycling information symbols – examples above) informs consumers in France, that the product or packaging should not be thrown away with household waste - but can be sorted or taken to a collection point to be recycled.









'Common' recycling symbol, informs consumers that the product or packaging can be recycled (where appropriate facilities exist) *Local authorities publish* details of recycling facilities and the types of materials which can be recycled. The two 'arrowed Heart' symbols will join these symbols (for UK consumer information) mid 2026 TBC.







The above recycling symbols are examples of those used in Italy, Portugal and Slovenia.

They communicate roughly the same information as the French symbols.

This International Resin Identification Coding System - uses alphanumeric codes to identify the different materials from which packaging is made (as well as the component reference) - to facilitate the recycling process.

















The Spanish have adopted a simple colour code system of recycling symbols.

**Yellow:** indicates Plastic, Canned and Tetra material. **Blue:** Paper and Cardboard. **Brown:** Compostable material. And **Green:** Glass. These colours and symbols, correspond with those displayed on recycling deposit bins and containers.
